Saturday 3rd September - Uckfield Bonfire Celebrations

Meeting up in the car park behind the cinema at 6.15pm if you want to go to the chippy, or in Grange Road from 7.00pm for a 7.30pm procession start. Roads close at 7.00pm. No flares, rookies or animals allowed. Hoops/Stripes and whites or costume to be worn please.

Saturday 10th September - Crowborough Bonfire Celebrations

Meeting in the Waitrose car park at 6.00pm to walk to Chapel Green (TN6 1ED) for Wreath laying at 7pm. Roads around Chapel Green will close at 6pm. The procession will leave the Green at 7.30pm. There will be prizes for best dressed societies on the evening. Recommended parking for the evening is in the Croft Road CarPark accessible from either Croft Road (by Waitrose TN6 1DL) or from Pine Grove (just past Old Mill Court TN6 1DZ). Crowborough don't allow flares or the dropping of firecrackers/ bangers. No animals please. Hoops/Stripes and whites or LBS costume to be worn please. There will be food trucks on Chapel Green.

Saturday 17th September - Mayfield Bonfire Celebrations

Meeting up around the middle of the High Street from 6.00pm.

Please do not park in the village. (Parking is NOT allowed in the Girls School or the Fire Station). Roads close at 6.30pm. Wreath laying 6.45pm at the Church on the High Street.

Procession form up on Station Road 7pm for 7.15pm start.

Bonfire lighting 9.15pm

Fireworks 9.45pm

Roads reopen 11.30pm.

Excellent refreshments available in the Hall at the Recreation Ground after the procession. No fireworks or rookies allowed. Flares must be disposed off in the torch dousing barrels on the High St. Hoops/Stripes and whites or LBS costume please.

Saturday 24th September - Burgess Hill Bonfire Celebrations

Meeting at the Cyprus Road car park from 6.30pm (though a few of us are likely to be at the chip shop in the shopping precinct earlier!). Parking is available in the Cyprus Road car park. Remembrance at the war memorial before the procession.

7.30pm procession start ending at the Boys Club field for fireworks.

No rookies or fireworks permitted.

Please wear hoops/stripes and whites or costume.

19.20 Bonfire procession commences. Torches lit by HBBS Assembly Crew, at the approach to the entrance to Robertson Street.

21.00 Procession arrives at fire-site.

21.15 Fireworks commence.

21.40 Fireworks complete (approx.)

23.00 Official lifting of road closures.

No fireworks/rookies etc in the procession or on the beach.

No animals please.

Hoops/ Stripes and whites or costume please.

Saturday 29th October - Newick Bonfire Celebrations

Meeting up by the Bakers (for sausage rolls etc) from 6.30pm for a 7.15pm procession start.

Hoops/stripes and whites or costume please.

No animals please.

SATURDAY 5th NOVEMBER - LINDFIELD BONFIRE

Based on previous years timings, the Procession will form up from 7.15pm, with the procession commencing at 7.30pm. Bonfire lit at 8.15pm followed by firework display

Chailey are our friends and neighbouring Bonfire Society and are noted for their moving remembrance ceremony.
