Our final outmeeting of the season always goes with a bang at Barcombe. A lovely procession through this usually quiet village, except for this one night of the year...



Lindfield's Bonfire Night – 4 November 2023

The weather gods had not been kind to us again in the run up to our night, with Storm Ciaran providing heavy rain and strong winds. Despite this, torch-dipping on the Friday, proved to be a pleasant day weather-wise, with the aroma of kerosene hanging in the air as we dipped over 600 torches ready for the day after. It's fair to say we stank of kerosene as we enjoyed a pint in the Standup Inn afterwards!

At 6.30am on the morning of the 4th, intrepid volunteers assembled on the Common in the pouring rain, to embark on the mighty task of preparing the Common for the evening. Unlike other societies, who can do this over a number of days due to their event being on private land, we have the Common for only one day, so have to race to get as much done as possible.

As soon as the firesite was fenced off, the task of building the bonfire commenced. A steady stream of pallet crates were carried from the Lewes Road entrance of the Common to avoid damaging it with vehicles.

While this was happening, the Guy emerged from his temporary home (sideways), and was taken to his place for the day outside Cottenhams Butchers, keeping LBS members company who manned a street collection

Arriving at the Common, the Guy was transferred to the Bonfire, and the traditional Bonfire Prayer was recited, before the fire was lit.

As night descended on Lindfield, visiting societies started to turn up, ready for the evening's festivities.

At the appointed time, the procession formed up. Led by our Harbour Master, David Riddle, with music provided by Burgess Hill Marching Youth Band, the procession moved off.

And then it was over. A year of planning, culminating in a few well-deserved drinks

With the display over, and the crowds heading home to dry out, LBS wombles deployed to the High Street to pick up litter. In Lewes, the council provides rubbish collection services, but in Lindfield we receive no such support, so we do it ourselves. The fire was finally extinguished at 2.30am, with the last LBS helpers heading for bed for a few hours sleep.

The morning after, we turned out again, this time to tidy the Common. Litter was picked up, fire ash and nails picked up, and we handed the Common back to the community – yet again in a better state than how we received it 24 hours previously.

The night was a success because of the contribution of so many LBS members and volunteers over the preceding 12 months. To you all, **THANK YOU!**
